Admission Policy

Course of Pharmacy

This doctoral program has been established based on a six-year undergraduate education and aims to foster researchers specializing in basic or clinical pharmaceutical research and clinical pharmacists who have outstanding specialized knowledge and the ability to conduct original research. The program also trains personnel who can take the lead in the drug-development process as well as specialized pharmacists. Individuals seeking admission to the doctoral program are required to possess an interest in the pharmaceutical research field and to demonstrate a high level of creativity and progressive thinking driven by intellectual curiosity. Given the specific nature of pharmacy as a subject and considering the public demand, application for admission can be made by individuals meeting any of following criteria: Pharmacy graduates who have completed the current six-year curriculum; certified pharmacists aged 24 or above who completed the old four-year curriculum; and post-graduates in pharmacy from any foreign educational institution.

Course of Pharmaceutical Sciences

This course comprises a two-year master's course and a three-year doctoral program, which have been established based on a four-year undergraduate educational program. The aim of this course is to foster pharmaceutical research scientists who are internationally active and possess outstanding research abilities in conducting research in the fields of basic pharmacy, such as pharmaceutical science and life science. The program also trains personnel who can take a lead in general (overall) drug development. Individuals who seek admission to the doctoral program are required to possess an interest in the pharmaceutical science research field and to demonstrate a high level of creativity and progressive thinking driven by intellectual curiosity.

Given the specific nature of pharmacy as a subject and considering the public demand, application for admission to the two-year master's course can be made by graduates from other universities or different majors, as well as by members of society or international students. Applicants to the doctoral course can come from the school of pharmacy as well as hold master's degrees in other scientific disciplines and may be members of society or international students, and shall meet any of following criteria: Pharmacy graduates who have completed the new six-year curriculum; certified pharmacists aged 24 or above who completed the old four-year curriculum; and post-graduates in pharmacy from any foreign educational institution.
